Classic Lisbon

Unveil Lisbon History and Traditions, the monuments of the Portuguese Discoveries and the most typical neighborhoods. Come with us, you won't regret it!



DESCRIPTION

A few hours to discover Lisbon, first of all we will visit the Belém quarter where you will find the most beautiful and historical monuments from the 15th and 16th centuries. A brief stop at the Belém Tower (Torre de Belém) - World Heritage by UNESCO - , point of departure of some of the Portuguese maritime explorations; and on the Monument to the Discoveries (Padrão dos Descobrimentos) , built to celebrate the 500th anniversary of the “death “ of Prince Henry the Navigator. Then we visit the church of S. Jerome Monastery (Mosteiro dos Jerónimos) - World Heritage by UNESCO - a masterpiece of the “Manueline” style and the National Coach Museum (Museu Nacional dos Coches) with one of the most important collection of old carriages in the world. Along the river we arrive at Alfama, an old and traditional district, where we will have the opportunity to walk in its narrow streets, and visit an handicraft shop where we'll taste an aperitif of Port wine. Then We will pass by the downtown (Baixa) to admire the most important squares of Lisbon such as the monumental Trade Square (Praça do Comércio); Rossio Square, the heart of Lisbon and the symbolic Restauradores Square. Then we drive along the Liberdade Avenue, the “boulevard” of Lisbon, to finish at Marquês de Pombal Square, admiring the statue of the 18th-century portuguese statesman responsible for Lisbon reconstruction after one of the most deadliest earthquakes in History, the 1755 Lisbon Earthquake.

Major Sights:

- Jerónimos' Monastery*, Tower of Belém, Monument to the Discoveries, Coach Museum*, Alfama & Rossio

*Note: The Jerónimos Monastery and the Coach Museum are both closed on Mondays, therefore those visits will be replaced by a visit to Palácio da Ajuda.

To better appreciate Lisbon, a city that straddles river and sea, take a cruise out on the Tagus and appreciate the variety of landscapes and monuments.

The entire history of the whole city unfurls before your eyes on this mini-cruise. There are also great views of the Parque das Nações, the site of Expo 98 and the location of the Oceanarium. This area now stands out for its modern architectural styles.

Sintra Deluxe

Be enchanted by the fantasy of Pena Palace, Palace who scored romanticism and Sintra village (Cultural Heritage of UNESCO) that enchanted kings and inspired poets.



DESCRIPTION

We set off from Lisbon for the impressive and romantic Pena Palace, located on one of the highest peaks in Serra de Sintra Natural Park. The Palace is characterised by its blend of styles, which combine to create an unmistakable appearance. At the end of the morning, there's some free time to wander the streets of the town that charmed kings and inspired poets. Take some time over the range of handicraft stores, tea-houses and savour some of the famous local sweets: queijadas and travesseiros. You may also take lunch while viewing rather special views out over the surrounding mountains. We then move onto Cabo da Roca, the most westerly point of continental Europe. We also take in Guincho beach, a favourite among windsurfers, and Boca do Inferno, with wonderful views out over the coast. We then visit the cosmopolitan town of Cascais, where there is a particularly magnificent view out over the bay before making our return to Lisbon along the coastline in front of Estoril, with views out over the Casino and its respective gardens.

*A trip made by tram (Sintra-Colares) from April to October – Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays. On other days, the distance is covered by bus.

Full day Óbidos, Batalha, Alcobaça, Fátima

Visit some of the places that marked the history of Portugal: Óbidos, the monasteries of Batalha and Alcobaça (UNESCO World Heritage Site) and Fatima.



DESCRIPTION

We depart first to encounter Óbidos and meet its medieval walls, rustic white houses and the rich and varied local traditions of the town. We then leave Óbidos for Alcobaça to take in the imposing monastery church (UNESCO world heritage), the first Gothic church to be built in Portugal and home to the tombs of the ill-starred lovers D. Pedro and D. Inês de Castro. We then head onto the picturesque and colourful fishing town of Nazaré for lunch. There's also the chance to find out something about the legends and traditions of this town. When possible, we go to Sítio, to marvel at its wonderful views out over Nazaré and its beaches. We then move onto Batalha to visit the monastery church (also UNESCO world heritage), a Gothic masterpiece with the most finely worked stained-glass windows. Finally, we reach the Our Lady of Fátima Sanctuary, an altar of the Christian faith and site of world pilgrimage. There is also the Chapel of Apparitions with its portrayal of Our Lady of Fátima. Take the time also for the location of the Basilica with the tombs of the three witnesses, and the Church of the Holy Trinity, the fourth largest in the world by capacity. You have some free time to attend mass. Travelling through this colourful agricultural region, we return to Lisbon.

Évora Wine tour

Discover the charms of the city of Évora, World Heritage Site, rich in history, architecture and cuisine and visit the well known "Herdade do Esporão" winery.



DESCRIPTION

We embark on a one-day voyage through the city of Évora – UNESCO World Heritage –, a mosaic of culture, history and traditions. Leaving Lisbon behind, we cross the bridge over the Tagus before, within a few kilometres, a pleasant landscape takes shape, dotted with cork oaks, olive groves and vineyards. In the distance, we pass walls before their whiteness tells us we have arrived in Évora. Here, wander the narrow streets and take the time to savour masterpieces of past eras and the key monuments of Évora: the Roman Temple, the Romanesque-Gothic Cathedral, the Church of São Francisco and its Chapel of Bones as well as the University. There is also the chance to explore the deep variety of handicrafts produced across the Alentejo including the renowned pieces in cork, ceramics and copper. Furthermore, take the opportunity to engage and experience the depth and breadth in the ingredients for some of the most defining dishes in the Portuguese gastronomic range.

Following lunch, in the afternoon, we set off in direction of the peaceful city of Reguengos de Monsaraz. Here we visit one of the most historical and important wine cellars in the country, named "Herdade do Esporão", and also where we get to taste the traditional Setúbal moscatel. At the end of this marvellous day, we make our return to Lisbon.

- Évora Historical Centre - UNESCO World Heritage, Roman Temple, Romanesque Gothic Cathedral, Bones Chapel, University
- Visit and Wine Tasting at the well known Herdade do Esporão Cellar.

DESCRIPTION

Belém Line:

Another name for the Belém Line could be the "Discoveries Line". Comprising 18 stops, this line takes you to some of the most memorable spots in a city famed for its light and exalted by writers and fado singers. The high point of the route is Belém, where the various monuments relating to the era of the Portuguese Discoveries tell tales of bygone kings and queens. Explorer Vasco da Gama's ships set sail from the riverside beaches here on their voyage to discover the sea route to India, and the splendour of Portugal's once great empire can be felt in the very air you breathe. The Monastery of Jerónimos, Torre de Belém (Belém Tower), Padrão dos Descobrimentos (the Monument to the Discoveries) and the National Coach Museum are absolutely not to be missed. And for those with a sweet tooth, we suggest you sample some of the famous Pastéis de Belem, a typical sweet Lisbon pastry.

Major Sights/ Stops:

- Marquês de Pombal, Avenida da Liberdade, Restauradores, Rossio Square, Comércio Square, Cais do Sodré, Coach National Museum, Archaeology National Museum, Naval Museum, Berardo Museum, Jerónimos Monastery, Belém Tower, Monument to the Discoveries, Alcântara/Docks, Ancient Art National Museum, Oriente Museum, Basílica da Estrela, City Museum, Electricity Museum, St. Anthony Church, Fernando Pessoa House, Saldanha, Campo Pequeno, Calouste Gulbenkian Museum, El Corte Inglés, Parque Eduardo VII, Design & Fashion Museum, Puppet Museum.

Oriente Line:

Complementing the Belém Line, and ideal for fun-seekers, the Oriente Line comprises 19 stops including one next to Lisbon Zoo, at Sete Rios, and another for the Oceanarium, at Parque das Nações. The line starts at Marquês de Pombal Square in the very heart of the city and takes you as far as Parque das Nações, or Park of Nations, where the 1998 World Fair (Expo 98) was held. The fair truly put Lisbon, and this particular part of it, in the spotlight and today the area is considered to be the newest and most modern in the city.

The Expo 98 site houses the Lisbon Oceanarium. Designed by architect Peter Chermayeff, it is the second largest facility of its kind in the world and is a must-see for all visitors. Our route takes us past the 7 hills of Lisbon, with the famous Bairro Alto, Príncipe Real and Chiado neighbourhoods, museums, fashion boutiques, art, antique shops, cafés, restaurants and viewpoints. The architecture in this part of the city is very modern and many leisure areas can be seen next to the River Tagus.

Major Sights / Stops:

- Marquês de Pombal, El Corte Inglés, Twin Towers, Lisbon Zoo / Sete Rios, Oceanarium, Lisbon Casino, Vasco da Gama Shopping Centre, Vasco da Gama Tower, Gare do Oriente, Poço do Bispo, Tile Museum/ Madre de Deus Convent, Estação de Santa Apolónia, Museu do Fado, Casa dos Bicos, Rua do Comércio, Chiado, Bairro Alto, Príncipe Real, Botanical Garden, Water Museum, Military Museum, St. Roque Church/Museum, National Pantheon.

Castle Line:

Although shorter, the Castle Line packs a huge amount into just 8 stops. The main attraction is the famous Castelo de S. Jorge (Castle of St. George), a “Lisbonite” icon that takes us on a journey back through the centuries to the time when Lisbon was ruled by the Moors. The city was recaptured from them by the first King of Portugal, D. Afonso Henriques, on the 25th of October 1147. Steeped in tradition, the typical neighbourhoods are the perfect place to truly get the feel of Lisbon: fado music, the low-rise buildings and the narrow streets.

Be sure to stop at the Portas do Sol viewpoint for a unique and breathtaking view of the city. Join us on this tour and relive the Lisbon of bygone days.

Major Sights/Stops:

- Marquês de Pombal, Parque Eduardo VII, Avenida da Liberdade, Restauradores, Rossio, Comércio Square, Casa dos Bicos, Fado Museum, Portas do Sol, Lisbon Cathedral, Alfama, St. Jorge Castle, St. Vincent Church, St. Anthony Church/Museum, Design & Fashion Museum.

Cascais Line:

Discover with us the beautiful city of Lisbon and the magnificent scenery of the Costa del Sol. Enjoy the extensive sandy beaches, ideal for relaxation or play sports, enjoy the beauty of places like the town of Cascais and Estoril and discover the history of them. Finish this tour admiring the contrast between the white sand dunes of Guincho beach and the foothills of the Serra de Sintra.

Major Sights/ Stops:

- Marquês de Pombal, Carcavelos, Estoril Casino, Cascais Bay, Guincho (Oitavos Fort*), Guincho (Porto de Santa Maria Restaurant**), Guincho (Orbitur Campism Site**), Cascais (Boca do Inferno), Casa das Histórias Paula Rego (Cascais), Monument to the Discoveries, Jerónimos Monastery, Berardo Museum, Naval Museum, Archaeology National Museum.
